Todd A. Watkins is Professor of Economics and Executive Director of the Martindale Center for the Study of Private Enterprise at Lehigh University. The Center engages students, faculty and the business community in active inquiry tackling questions central to understanding and fostering sustainable private enterprises and inclusive economic systems throughout the world.

His extensive nonprofit experience currently includes serving on the Boards of Directors of the Rising Tide Community Loan Fund, the Lehigh Valley Arts and Cultural Alliance, and the Africa Network, San Antonio, TX, and he was a founding member of the Faculty Advisory Council for ACCION International's Center for Financial Inclusion, in Washington, DC.

He holds a Ph.D. and Master in Public Policy from Harvard University, as well as a B.S. in Optics from the University of Rochester, where he also studied violin at the Eastman School of Music.

In his spare moments, Dr. Watkins has been a longtime first violinist with the Lehigh University Philharmonic Orchestra, was a founding member of South Mountain Mariachi, and before moving to the Lehigh Valley served as principal second violinist with the New England Philharmonic.
